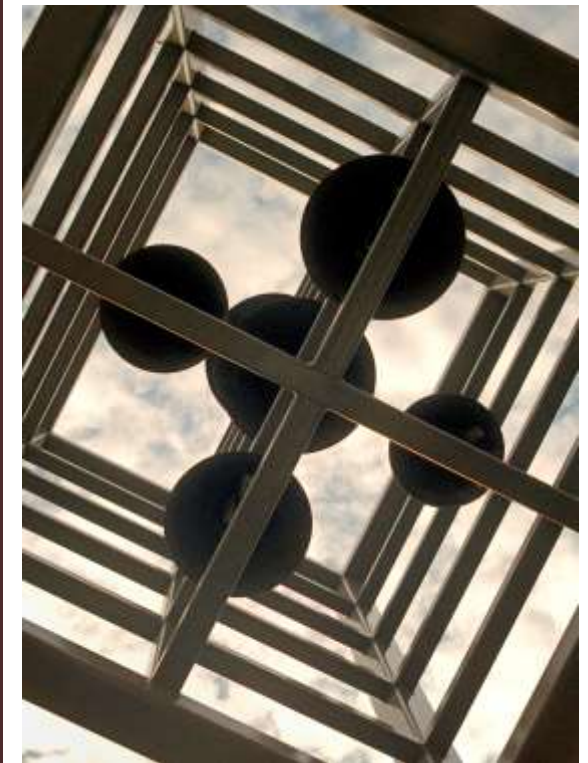

St. Bartholomew's Church is a parish in the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta. We open our doors to all who seek God or a deeper knowledge of God. We are pleased you have chosen to visit us. ## Your Joining

Make an appointment for a personal visit with one of the clergy of St. Bartholomew's. This is most conveniently done by calling the parish office, (404) 634-3336, Monday thru Thursday.

For those who are baptized and transferring from another denomination, baptismal information is needed to record the new membership. Confirmation classes are usually offered in the Spring.

For those not baptized, instruction will be scheduled, and preparation made for baptism.

For those transferring from another Episcopal congregation, it is necessary that the parish office be notified so that a "Letter of Transfer" can be obtained from the former congregation. The national Church requires that we keep accurate records of our membership. A letter of transfer is simply a courtesy that assists in this regard.

## Your Commitment

In an effort to strengthen each of us and the community on our spiritual journey, each member is encouraged to be regular in prayer and to worship each Sunday at St. Bartholomew's (Members who work on Sundays are invited to attend the Sunday evening service or the Wednesday noon service); to be dedicated in service and to support, with time and effort, the work and ministry of St. Bartholomew's; to be conscientious in the financial support of the church.
